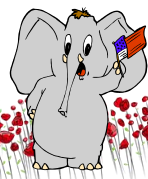

George Radanovich
CANDIDATE: CA STATE SENATE



George Radanovich is a native of a Mariposa County farm family and a former member of Congress. He is a graduate of CalPoly San Luis Obispo. In 1982 George began growing grapes in Mariposa County and in 1986 he opened the Radanovich Winery, the first winery in the region. He was the first winemaker to serve in Congress since Thomas Jefferson.

George served as a member of the Mariposa County Board of Supervisors from 1988 to 1992. In 1994 George ran for Congress, defeating entrenched incumbent Democrat Richard Lehman by 17 points. Radanovich was immediately elected President of the 74-member Freshman Class of Republicans.

In Congress, George served as a key member of the Resources Committee, Chairman of the National Parks, Recreation and Public Lands Subcommittee, Chairman of the Water and Power Subcommittee and Co-Chair of the Water Caucus. He served in Congress from 1994 to 2010, becoming a leading advocate for California's agricultural, resources and recreational communities. He voluntarily retired from Congress in 2010.

After leaving Congress, George served as Chairman of the Board of a small family retail business founded by his parents in 1955. In 2016 George become President of the California Fresh Fruit Association. He left that position in 2019 to promote agriculture, labor, water and veteran's policies in Washington, D.C. and across the nation.

Capitol Update

SB-1384 – GUN STORE REGULATIONS

This bill requires all licensed firearm dealers to have a digital video surveillance system meeting certain standards, to have general liability insurance coverage of at least one million dollars, and to require certain training for all employees annually. This is a very encompassing bill that puts many requirements on gun store owners.

SB-1327 – CIVIL LIABILITY GUNS

This bill creates a private right of action that allows individuals to file civil suits against anyone who manufactures, distributes, transports, sells or imports firearms banned in California, as well as precursor firearm parts. Current law allows for remedies for illegal activities by firearm dealers and manufacturers.

AB-1621 – FIREARMS: UNSERIALIZED FIREARMS

This bill expands what is considered a “precursor part” under existing law and requires serial numbers on those parts. Further, it expands the definition of a “firearm” for purposes of criminal and regulatory penalties to include “precursor parts”. And, it prohibits the possession, transfer, sale or advertising of milling machines that have the sole or primary purpose of manufacturing firearms. Unfinished frames or receivers are not regulated as firearms under federal law; however, they are already regulated under state law and are limited to being transferred by licensed vendors in California.

AB-2193 – CIVIL REPRESENTATION: IMMIGRATION STATUS

Existing law, the Sargent Shriver Civil Counsel Act, requires legal counsel to be appointed to represent low-income parties in civil matters involving critical issues affecting basic human needs in courts selected by the Judicial Council. The act requires the Judicial Council to develop one or more programs involving specific types of civil matters, including, among others, housing-related matters, probate conservatorships, guardianships, and domestic violence and civil harassment restraining orders.

This bill would require the programs to provide services without regard to the citizenship or immigration status of the person represented, and if an organization is prohibited, due to other funding restrictions, from representing certain persons due to their citizenship or immigration status, would require the organization to refer those individuals for services elsewhere.

AB-1797 – IMMUNIZATION REGISTRY

This bill would require health care providers and other agencies, including schools, childcare facilities, family childcare homes and county human services agencies to disclose the specified immunization information, and would add the patient’s or client’s race or ethnicity to the list of information that shall or may be disclosed.

The bill would additionally authorize schools, childcare facilities, family childcare homes and county human services agencies to use the specified immunization information, in the event of a public health emergency, to perform immunization status assessments of pupils, adults and clients to ensure health and safety.

Existing law requires schools, childcare facilities, family childcare homes, and county human services agencies to maintain the confidentiality of the specified immunization information and to only use the information for specified purposes, including to carry out their responsibilities regarding required immunization for attendance or participation benefits, or both. AB-1797 will change the confidentiality of the information with broad reporting.
